Dr. James C. Abegglen (1926–2007) was a pioneer in introducing Japanese management methods to the West. He authored many publications on business management, most prominently *The Japanese Factory: Aspects of Its Social Organization* in 1958, which has been a must-read in the field ever since.

He was also an influential figure in Japanese and US business relations, establishing the first American business-consulting firm in Tokyo as one of the founders of the Boston Consulting Group. In addition, he devoted himself to the education of future generations as a professor and director of the Graduate School at Sophia University, and dean emeritus of GLOBIS University.

The I-House Library received his book collection in his will, and to mark the tenth-year anniversary of this bequest, we have published *The James C. Abegglen Memorial Collection at the International House of Japan Library*. To celebrate the publication, Prof. Kent Calder, US-Japan political relations specialist, Director, Edwin O. Reischauer Center for East Asian Studies, Johns Hopkins SAIS; Ms. Miki Tsusaka, Senior Partner & Managing Director and executive committee member at the Boston Consulting Group; and Mr. Yoshito Hori, President of GLOBIS University, Managing Partner, GLOBIS Capital Partners, will talk about Abegglen and the evolution of Japanese management. Participants are invited to the reception afterwards.
